Getting to Know Our Pensioner Trustees

As you are all aware the Fund went through a Trustee election process at the beginning of the year for members and pensioners to elect a new Board of Trustees. In particular two pensioner-trustees, Dr Wessel Swart and Mr Ted Green, were re-elected to the Board to represent pensioners' interests. We caught up with them to get to know a bit more about them.

MRTED GREEN

You have recently been re-elected as a pensioner Trustee of the Fund. Why did you feel it was important for you to stand for election again?

In the best interest of the pensioners I felt it was important to make myself available for re-election because of projects that still needed to be completed. These projects are important as they directly impact the beneficiaries of the Eskom Pension and Provident Fund.

In your view what makes the role of pensioner Trustees important?

The Trustees of the Fund have an obligation to understand (Cont'd on page 2)



the important role that they must fulfil in ensuring that the Fund is under the Trustees' control and is managed according to the law. Trustees must take all reasonable steps to protect the interests of the pensioners.

What impact and contribution would you like to make to the Board of Trustees and the pensioners of the Fund?

The existing Board of Trustees is an excellent team. The following are fundamental duties that I feel strongly about which must be taken seriously by every Trustee:

- Taking reasonable steps to protect the interests of pensioners
- Acting with due care, diligence and good faith; and
- Ensuring good governance of the Fund e.g.
 - Ensure adherence to the Code of Conduct
 - Read all audit reports carefully
 - Check risk assessments
 - Ensure maintenance of proper control systems
 - Ensure the Fund is totally transparent
 - Ensure I.T. systems are in place to support Fund operations
 - Ensure books of account and all such records etc. are properly maintained

How long have you been retired?

I have been retired for 10 years. I relocated from Kyalami in Gauteng to Ballito in KwaZulu Natal following my retirement.

What did you do whilst working for Eskom?

You have recently been re-elected as a pensioner Trustee of the Fund. Why did you feel it was important for you to stand for election again?

For me the issue was not about standing for an election but rather being nominated for my strengths and capabilities. To my knowledge I was re-elected with the highest number of votes recorded in the EPPF history.

In your view what makes the role of pensioner Trustees important?

One should distinguish between appointed Trustees and elected Trustees. With appointed Trustees there is an underlying and indirect responsibility to whoever appoints them for their efficiency and effectiveness. The pensioner-elected Trustees are publicly elected and their roles are governed by the provisions and terms of relevant acts and the time honoured position of trustees. Pensioners do not have formal structures to ensure that their interests are adequately addressed, having contracted through conditions of service with their previous employer to generate funds for their golden years. Trustees have the fiduciary duty to ensure that wisdom prevails.

What impact and contribution would you like to make to the Board of Trustees and the pensioners of the Fund?

My impact and contribution will be found in my judgemental, technical and analytical abilities. My value system dictates that I take a position not necessarily in line with social and political current situations but in the realisation that Trustees are entrusted with the investments made by pensioners and members and that decisions are taken to overcome the struggle of poverty.

How long have you been retired?

I retired five years ago in November 2007.

What did you do whilst working for Eskom?

I joined Eskom in 1985. Having worked for multinationals, I was in the Engineering Group during the successful capital expenditure programme. Thereafter I worked in Generation and Eskom Enterprises and retired as a Group Commercial Consultant.

What do you do in your spare time?

I honestly do not have spare time as I am a workaholic. I am an active farmer and am also doing further research on renewable energy topics. I am also actively involved in issues of environmental planning and local government practices.
